## HERNE HILL TRACK

### Barney Storey Runner-up in White Hope Sprint

Barney Storey placed second in the White Hope Sprint at Herne Hill on Good Friday behind another local rider Robin Thompson (Hargroves Cycles).

He was 2nd in the 200m time trial recording an excellent outdoor time of 11.91 seconds, only 2 tenths slower than the current British sprint champion Craig MacLean (WCPP/ City of Edinburgh). Progressing through the heats and semi-finals, the competition was of a far higher standard than last year, and the final contained four riders, with only Storey, Thompson and David Heald (WCPP /VC St Raphael) really in with a chance.

Run over 2 laps of the track, the four riders bunched around the top of the track, rode at a steady pace until Thompson attacked with half a lap to go, and with Storey and Heald both tussling shoulder to shoulder down the finishing straight, Thompson just managed to hold on for the best win of his racing career.



## CLUB TANDEM 30 RECORD BROKEN

Steve Brown and Max Rumball knocked two minutes off the club tandem 30-mile record in the Nodond Combine Tandem event on 7th May.

In wet and breezy conditions on the F1 course in Bedfordshire, they clocked 1:07:04 to win the event by nearly a minute. A 5-mile stretch of country lanes, used due to roadworks on the original course, plus a rising headwind on the return leg, put paid to hopes of a better time on the normally fast A1 road.

## TRACK RACING



Reports by Andy Storey

### Portsmouth Track

Over the Easter weekend, Barney Storey rode the Portsmouth Easter Open meeting taking second place behind Andy Slater (WCPP/VC St Raphael) in the Open Sprint and 1 mile scratch, which gave him 3rd in the overall Omnium title behind James Taylor (City of Edinburgh) and Slater. On Easter Sunday at Calshot, he went on to take the Warm-up, Unknown distance and the Sprint title, which again gave him 3rd in the Omnium title behind Andy Russell and Jamie Streater (both VC St Raphael).

With this successful campaign over for the first part of the season, Storey is now looking forward to the beginning of the Sprinters League, which start at Reading track on the 11th June, and then the National Championships held at Manchester Velodrome in July.

### Reading Open Track Meeting

Barney Storey won the Open Sprint title in style by four bike lengths, beating his White Hope Sprint rival Robin Thompson (Hargroves) saluting to the crowd as his rode over the line.

It was a successful night for Barney who rode to 3rd in the 10 lap Warm-up event, as well as taking 3rd in the Keirin final, beaten by ex-National Criterium and current National Motor paced champion Simon Cope (Heron RT/Omega). Also racing on the track for the first time in 12 months was brother Andy, who scored 3rd place in the Devil and 3rd place in the 'B' Final of the Open Sprint.

Barney and Andy are now looking forward to the start of racing at Portsmouth Track League, and Barney will be one of the few local riders in with a chance of glory at the up and coming Sprinters League meeting at Palmer Park, Reading.

# IN THIS MONTH

## 50 Years ago

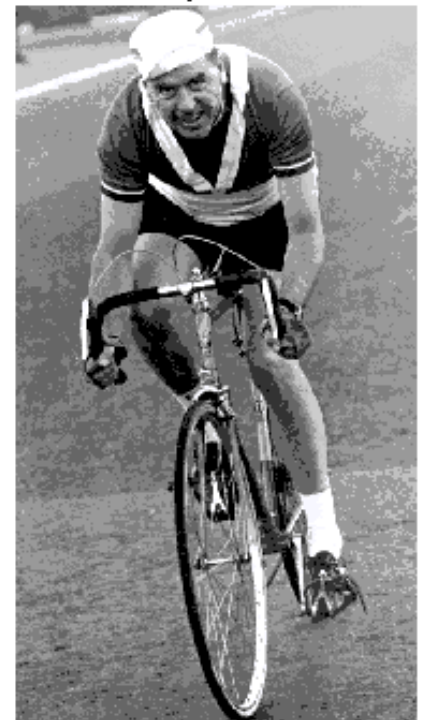
7 May 1950 - The club men's solo and team records fell on a super-fast day in the Bournemouth Arrow 25. Gerry Ingrekn knocked 1:17 off the old record with a time of 1:01:25. Backed up by John Hughes with 1:03:16 and George Attenborough with 1:05:25 they set a new team record of 3:10:06. Winner was Ken Whitmarsh of Southampton Whs with 58:54, less than a minute outside the National Competition Record.

## 40 Years Ago

8 May 1960 - For the first time a Jubilee rider beat the hour. In the Bournemouth Arrow 25, Pete Bazeley clocked 59:49, breaking Dave Fletcher's 7-year old record by 16 seconds. It was a good morning with 11 riders under the hour, fastest being Harry Jackson of Portsmouth North End in 58:16. Pete went on to knock another 9 seconds off the record a couple of months later in the Jubilee open 25.

## 10 Years Ago

3 June 1990 - The Club were stunned to learn of the death of Ray Price at the age of 57. Ray had been a stalwart of the club since 1946 and had taken part in just about every aspect of cycle racing including track, time trials, road racing and cycle polo. Ray had been a BCF Commissaire and Judge, Vice-President and President of the Jubilee, not to mention Chairman and Secretary of the RTTC South DC, where he had served on the committee for 24 years.

PARKINSON GETS STAGE WIN  
IN US

As you'll probably know Nigel Parkinson has been racing in the US and has just ridden the 5-day The Tour of Gila, known as one of the hardest stage races in America due to the weather & altitude.

He finished the opening 15 mile time trial in 23rd place. The following day Nigel won the 70-mile stage 2. He attacked after about 30 miles ending up with a break of 3 riders. They got a 2:40 gap when the main field started to chase, by that time they had hit some serious hills so Nigel attacked on the last hill, winning by 35secs. The following day was another hilly stage.

Nigel did a lot of sitting in but started to chase with about 10 miles to go, moving himself up to 4th overall. Stage 4 was a criterium and he just sat in the pack and got towed around for 1½ hours.

The final day was a big 105-mile stage. Nigel survived a number of attacks, notably from the Trek team and finished 7th on the stage and a healthy 5th overall.
