NATIONAL TRACK CHAMPIONSHIPS

Barney Storey stepped onto the National Championships podium for the first time in his relatively short track racing career by taking the Silver medal in the Open Keirin in Manchester at the end of July.

The first event for Barney was the Open Kilometre Standing Start Time Trial. Barney was not on a good day, and although he recorded a personal best time, as well as a new club record of 1.08.387 averaging just under 33mph he was bitterly disappointed by the result, placing him in 11th position behind another local rider Robin Thompson (Hargroves Cycles). The event was won by national record holder Jason Queally (Lancaster CC) who won with a championship record 1.03.081.

After a four day break, Barney was in action again with the Open Sprint. Barney qualified 6th with an excellent 11.089 seconds which was again a new club record averaging 40.6mph, which on a 94" (49 x 14) gear is going some. By finishing in the top 8, Barney was the seeded rider in his first round qualifier against John Taylor (Woolwich CC) and Andrew Knowles (Matlock CC). He won in 11.361, the quickest heat of all the rounds. In the second round Barney was unfortunately drawn against Chris Hoy (City of Edinburgh RC) who went onto the win the heat, putting Barney into the second round repechages. Barney was drawn against 5th seed Anton Quist (Team Orrell) who won by pushing Barney further up the track on the final corner making it impossible to pass. Barney eventually placed 9th.



After a day off, Barney was back in action in the Open Keirin, determined to perform better. Barney took to the front of his first round heat, in which he aimed to start the sprint with two laps remaining, leaving the slower and more dangerous riders behind. In the semi-final, Barney was faced with a tough heat - but successfully managed to pull away with Alywn McMath (Atom Elite RT) to qualify for the final. In the final both Alywn and Barney were joined by the top seed Craig MacLean (City of Edinburgh RC) who will be representing Great Britain in this event at the Sydney Olympics. The final was a surprisingly close run event, Barney started the sprint with a lap to go, but MacLean overtook him on the back straight leaving McMath in third, unable to hold the pace.

ROGERS WINS OPEN 50

Paul Rogers of VC St Raphael was the runaway winner of the Jubilee 50-mile time trial, beating second placed Michael Loader (Yeovil CC by over 6 minutes). The Salisbury trio of Paul Whatley, Derek Hambleton and Ian Ayliffe picked up the team award with an aggregate of 6:11:04.

Jubilee failed to get a rider in the top 10 with Paul Foxwell a non-starter and Steve Pye puncturing. Club honour was saved however with Phil Harvey putting in a fine ride to win the handicap award (and winning the Enfield Trophy) and Mike Woodgate the clear winner of the veteran on standard award.

In the tandem event, with just two machines competing, Steve Brown and Max Rumball were nearly 13 minutes clear of the Sotonia CC pairing of Mary Churcher and Norman Harvey.

VICTORY FOR EAMONN IN BJW ROAD RACE

After winning the national 12-hour championship Eamonn Deane announced he wanted to win a proper road race and one of his own club's open events. In the Jubilee Purbeck road race he whooped with delight when he crossed the line achieving the double. "I wanted to win that," he said afterwards.

Last year's winner accountant Rory Wyley (Thames Velo) miscalculated on the strength of Deane, setting the pace on first two of seven climbs out of Wool, while the home rider held back. Eamonn took over the lead on the fourth ascent, next time the pair moved clear. Deane went alone the last time winning by a minute. "I went too hard early on and was shattered on the last lap" agreed Wyley.

IN THIS MONTH

40 Years Ago

4 September 1960 - There's nothing like a bit of rivalry between local clubs, especially when you win. In the inter-club 25, the Jubilee team of Pete Bazeley, Terry Dunn, John Roll and Alan Strong really went to town and retained the David Luck Memorial Trophy for the third successive year. Their combined time of 4:06:06 knocked a massive 6 minutes off the event record, beating Bournemouth Arrow by 11 minutes and Poole WHs by 20 minutes. Just to rub it in, we also won the junior competition with Terry Dunn, Gerry Gray and Paul Hayes clocking a total of 3:19:13.

25 Years Ago

7 September 1975 - John Pearce put in an excellent ride for second place in the Jubilee Open 100 with a time of 4:23:37, beating his own, 5 year old, club record by just 8 seconds. John also led William Suttie, in 3rd with 4:27:35 and Bruce Cameron, 6th with 4:33:31 to a team win and club team record of 13:24:43. Winner was Cliff Sharp of Eastbourne Rovers with 4:14:22. John's ride also put him into the lead of the South DC Best All-Rounder Competition, which he won by a margin of just 0.062mph over Fred Newton of Wessex RC.

NATIONAL SPRINTERS LEAGUE

Halesowen Track - 20 August

Barney Storey produced a good 3rd place at the latest round of the BCF's National Sprinters league. First place went to new sprint sensation Ross Edgar (Dataphonics CC) with James Taylor (City of Edinburgh CT) in second.

The race started with the 200m time trial for the riders to gain their seeding. Barney finished second behind Taylor, with Edgar third, the times being rather slow on the outdoor track. The first and second rounds went smoothly for the top 3 seeds, with Storey edging out local favourite and national sprint quarter finalist Martin Osman (Birmingham CC), to take the second round. The semi-final saw up against Edgar and past national sprint medal winner Richard Kennedy (Chesterfield Coureurs). Kennedy went for a long sprint forcing Barney to chase with Edgar taking his slipstream and coming past to take the victory. In the final Edgar claimed victory from Taylor by less than half a wheel.

The minor placing final was won in dominant fashion by Barney who used his strength and speed to beat his other three opponents Kennedy, Osman and Steve Pulford (VC St Raphael). All four riders had been side by side on the back straight before Storey accelerated away. This leaves Barney 4th overall in the league, with the next event at Nottingham prior to the final at Manchester.

PARKINSON ON PODIUM IN US

Nigel Parkinson is going from strength to strength racing in the United States. He finished 2nd in the Nevada/Ca Kooka cup series, won by his team mate Eric Jones who went flying off into the lead. Nigel stayed with him for a while but found himself going far too hard so, seeing that there was no one in sight, slowed and held on off until the finish.

Nigel was 2nd again in the 11 mile Snowbird hill-climb in Utah, also won by Eric Jones. There were 345 starters the most in the 22 years they have been running it. There were three big road teams competing but the mountain bikers proved too strong. Nigel finishing only 17 seconds off the lead but nearly a minute ahead of the next man.

MORE TANDEM RECORDS

Steve Brown and Max Rumball set a club men's tandem 50-mile record of 1:53:55 in the Jubilee open 50 on 13th August, amazingly this was the first tandem 50 recorded in the club's 65-year history.

On 3 September, in the Border CA event at Bentley in Hampshire, Steve Brown and Paul Jarvis broke the men's tandem 30 record with 1:07:00, just four seconds faster than the previous mark set by Steve and Max earlier in the year. The pair had been a minute down on schedule at 20 miles but managed to raise their pace for a fast second lap of the course.

GENERAL MEETING BACKS HELMET RULE

The Jubilee General Meeting on 21st August overwhelmingly backed the compulsory use of approved safety helmets in time trials. The issue is to be debated at the RTTC AGM later in the year and if passed, could come in to effect next year.

The other major topic discussed was the problem of finding marshals for events. A rota for all members to marshal once or twice a year was suggested whilst others disliked the idea of compulsion. It is quite clear that the reluctance of members to assist with running both club and open events could jeopardise the future of those events. In the end the matter was referred to the committee to produce a proposal for the club AGM in the new year.

The meeting approved the running of the same 5 open time trials in 2001, the Purbecks road race, the cyclo-cross plus possibly promoting one of the National Junior Road Race Series events in March.

GREETINGS FROM NEW ZEALAND

It was great to discover the BJW web site. I was a member of the BJW from the mid 50's until I went to Canada in '67. The archives section was fascinating, the names listed brought memories flooding back. Each time I am back in Bourne mouth I drop into the club rooms and catch up with the people I know, on the last occasion I think Ted Nippard was the only one but I did have a long talk with John Pearce at the Arrow 25.
