CLUB BEST ALL-ROUNDER

Congratulations to Eamonn Deane on winning the club men's best all-rounder competition and the William Taylor Trophy for the 5th time. His average was nearly 1 ½ mph faster than last year's winner, Steve Clark, who just pipped Steve Pye for the runner-up slot by virtue of a faster 25. Steve Pye, along with Barrie Stevens and Jonathan Charman, all make their first appearance in the table. Philippa Brayford was unopposed this year but joins Eamonn as a five-time trophy winner, picking up the Barbara Boyland Cup, which she first won in 1991. Eamonn unsurprisingly dominates the veteran on scratch tables but still can't challenge Mike Woodgate in the veteran on standard table. Mike wins the Atty Memorial Trophy for an incredible 17th time.

50 Years Ago

The gears used may be of interest (all on fixed wheel), Gordon used 62", Jack 64.8" and Mike 56".

35 Years Ago

24 October 1965 - On a dull and breezy day, Alan Strong powered up Kingston Hill on a 69" fixed gear to beat his own hill record by 4.6 seconds. His time of 2:03.0 for the Jubilee Hill Climb was to stand for no less than 32 years, eventually being broken by Peter Dairty in 1997 with 1:58.0.

CLUB RUNS

Lepe - 8 Oct

We always seem to have a sunny day for the run across the New Forest to Lepe and this year was no exception. A good crowd of 16 riders headed out through Buxley and Holmsley to Brookenhurst, just in time for the level crossing gates to close in front of us. After a short wait we were off again via Hatchett Pond and Beaulieu to the café at Lepe Foreshore with a view across the Solent.

Swanage - 22 Oct

A turnout of 17 despite a chilly and cloudy start. A slight delay when Nicki had that sinking feeling, courtesy of a stripped seatpin bolt. The problem was solved by Barrie "I don't need bolts - my bike's held together by rust" Stevens and we set off. Heading west through Mezley, Corfe Mullen, Lytchett Matravers and Bloxworth we then turned down to Wareham (level crossing again - but no train this week) then looped out around the heath to Corfe Castle. There was some debate over the final section of the route and, amidst threats to the well-being of the club run leader, we headed up Kingston Hill. After a good descent through Langton Matravers we arrived in Swanage for lunch, having covered 36 miles since Bear Cross. The sun finally came out for our return journey, the majority opting for the short cut across the ferry to Sandbanks.

Fordingbridge - 29 Oct

The forecast of gales didn't seem to deter riders as 15 turned out on a bright and breezy morning. The route went across Avon Causeway, through Hightown and across Stoney Plain. Down Nomansland and looping round via Hamptworth we climbed up through Lower where Jonathan took on Bill's challenge to ride up in the big ring. He succeeded, but not without pulling some interesting faces on the final steeper section. An unplanned interlude to regroup at Woodfalls after Mike and Paul took the scenic route ("Oh! Did we miss out the hill?") and we dropped down to Woodgreen and into Fordingbridge via Breamore. With the weather beginning to close in, we took a shorter route back, splitting in to two groups north of Ringwood, with some heading down the Avon Valley, the rest via Verwood.

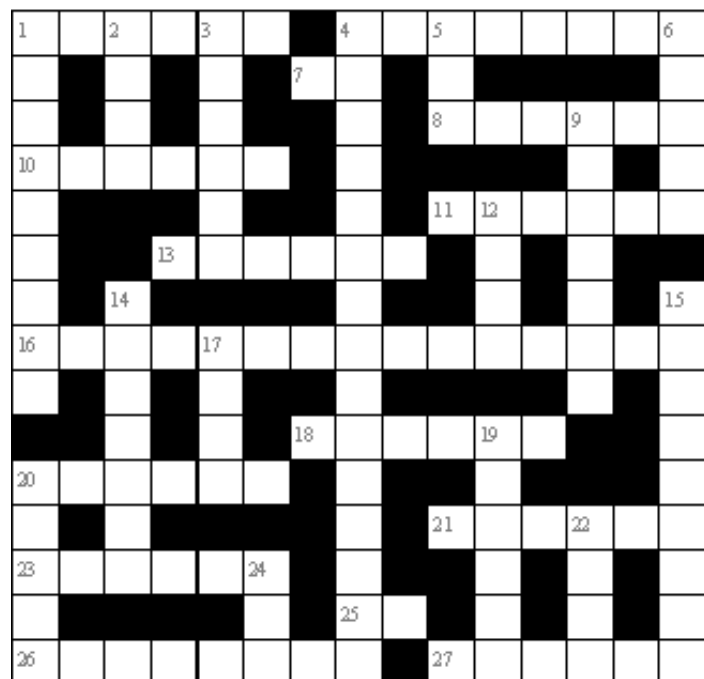
